How This Works

The Process for Parents/Guardians/Faith Mentors

- 1. Determine when it is time for your child to prepare for First Communion. There is no set age when this may happen. We all proceed on our own schedule.
- 2. Take time to pray and ask God for guidance and knowledge along this journey.
- 3. Review the standard materials and determine if additional information and/or guidance is needed.
- 4. Speak with the pastor, letting them know you are beginning to prepare your child for First Communion. Request additional information if needed for your own clarification, as you should understand the Sacrament of Holy Communion yourself.
- 5. Work through the materials with your child. You may ask for help or additional information at anytime during the teaching process. All children are different, and you may be surprised by the questions or connections that are made. Truly listen and seek to understand what your child is asking. If you don't know the answer to a question, an appropriate answer is, "I'm not sure, let me find out."
- 6. Upon completion of the materials, schedule an interview with the pastor so that the pastor may determine if your child is ready to take First Communion.
- 7. In Lutheran tradition, baptism was required for first communion and may be scheduled prior to communion.

Communion at Salem Hetzel's Church is OPEN to everyone.

Once you receive the free gift of salvation (by God's grace alone), the Holy Spirit will always be with you, guiding you to do the right things.









1 John 1:9


Ask God to forgive you for any wrong things you have done, said, or thought. God will forgive you and give you a clean heart.

In the land where Jesus lived. eating with someone was a way of saying "I love you. You matter to me."


Jesus ate with everyone.

Communion with Our Church

The *altar* is the table at the front of the church that holds the communion elements. An altar is a visual reminder of Old Testament sacrifice and of Christ's sacrifice on the cross.



What are the Communion Elements?

~ The body of Christ may be any type of bread, wafer, or cracker. ~The blood of Christ may be any type of wine or juice made from grapes (Luke 22:18).



- **Gather**: The elements are gathered and set up on the altar.
- Consecrate: The pastor says a special blessing over the elements to make them sacred, or holy, like God.
- Invite: The congregation is invited to partake in Holy Communion together.
- Pray: We ask God for guidance and forgiveness and offer praise and thanks.
- **Distribute and Partake**: We share and eat the bread and drink the wine.
- Bless: The pastor says a blessing over members of the congregation.

Make Communion Bread for Our Church!


Ingredients

- 2 cups whole wheat flour
- 1 cup white flour
- 1 1/4 tsp baking powder
- 1 1/4 tsp salt
- 4 tsp oil
- 3/4 cup + 2 TBSP hot water
- 3 TBSP honey
- 3 TBSP molasses



Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 2. Sift dry ingredients together three times.
- 3. Stir in oil
- 4. In separate bowl mix wet ingredients together until dissolved.
- 5. Add wet ingredients to dry ingredients and mix well. Dough should be sticky. Do not knead.
- 6. Divide dough into four balls and flatten each into a 1/4 inch thick disk.
- 7. With knife, score top of each disk into eight pie-shaped sections.
- 8. Lay the loaves on a baking sheet and bake for 10 minutes.
- 9. Remove from the oven and brush the tops of the loaves with oil. Bake an additional 5-8 minutes. Let cool, then enjoy!

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION

Also known as the **Eucharist**, which means thanksgiving in Greek.

A *sacrament* is something Jesus commanded us to do.

Through our human senses, we experience an invisible

act of God's grace.

What We See, Touch, Smell, Taste:

Eating bread
Drinking wine or juice

What it Means:

The bread is Christ's body. The wine is Christ's blood. Eating and drinking shows our faith in God's promise of salvation.




Salvation Through Christ

Because he loves us, Jesus allowed his body to be punished for our sins. He died, broken and bleeding, so that we may live. When we eat the bread and drink the wine/juice, we believe this: Jesus freely gave his body and blood for us, so that our sins may be forgiven and we may live with God forever.

God loves you forever and always, no matter what!


